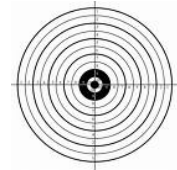

NRA and CRPA Foundation Assisting California High School Student

Kalifornia - The NRA and the CRPA Foundation have joined forces under their California Legal Action Project (LAP) to provide legal assistance for high school student Gary Tudesko in his fight to be readmitted to Willows High School. Sixteen-year-old Tudesko was expelled on November 19th for having unloaded shotguns in his pick-up truck that he legally parked on an off-campus, public street near the Willows High School campus.

The high school is in a small rural community near Sacramento. The unloaded shotguns were in his truck because he had gone duck hunting in the early morning hours before school. The case has garnered significant national media coverage as an example of zero-tolerance policies run amuck. The shotguns were discovered in the pick up truck by scent-sniffing dogs on October 26th during a questionable school search. Police ran the license plates and determined Tudesko was the owner, then called Tudesko out of class. Tudesko cooperated and readily told the Principal about the shotguns and his early morning hunting trip. The school first suspended Tudesko for five days, then extended the suspension indefinitely until an expulsion hearing was held. Tudesko's mother, Susan Parisio defended her son during the November public hearing on his expulsion. She challenged the school district's legal jurisdiction to enforce the Education Code's prohibition of guns on campus for her son having unloaded shotguns locked in an off-campus vehicle parked on a public street. Nonetheless, Willows High Principal Mort Geivett told the local School Board that, as a matter of law, it had no choice but to expel Tudesko. The Board did just that. (*Notice of Expulsion is posted at www.calgunlaws.com*).

Geivett claimed the school had jurisdiction over students traveling to and from school, as well as students off-campus during lunch, and that the school had jurisdiction over off campus vehicles because students could not possess firearms within 1000 feet of campus. But Geivett confused the Penal Code with the Education Code. With a number of exceptions, it is a potential criminal violation of the Penal Code, specifically the Gun Free School Zones law, to knowingly possess a gun within 1000 feet of a school. But that law has nothing to do with the sections of the Education Code Tudesko is charged with violating, which generally prohibit possession of firearms on school grounds. (*Education Code sections Tudesko allegedly violated posted at www.calgunlaws.com*).

Tudesko's truck was parked off school grounds. And Gary was not traveling to or from school at the time of the search of the off-campus truck. He was in class. Moreover, schools do not enforce criminal / penal statutes like the Gun Free School Zones law, the District Attorney does. And the District Attorney and Willows Chief of Police have already stated there would be no charges filed against Tudesko, likely because there was no intent to violate the law.

Tudesko is now appealing the local school district's expulsion order to the Glenn County Board of Education. A hearing is scheduled for January. Tudesko is now being defended by civil rights lawyers Chuck Michel and Hillary Green of the Long Beach based law firm of Michel & Associates. Legal issues aside, Tudesko is in this position because of a short-sighted bureaucratic approach to enforcing the school's "zero tolerance" policy toward firearms, which is in many schools and cases is misapplied. Time and again these policies have resulted in a triumph of irrational political correctness over common sense and justice. Given that Tudesko had gone duck hunting that same morning with friends (hence the two shot-guns), had bird-shot loads as ammunition, had both firearms unloaded, had intentionally parked off-campus to avoid any issues, and had several people corroborate his story, school administrators should have acknowledged that the circumstances did not warrant expulsion.)

HealthCare Bill Excludes Guns as Health Threat »

Guns could no longer be considered a threat to health under health care reform if Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid's compromise passes.

In all the deal making and tinkering to win support for the bill, Reid added a provision to prevent the Secretary of Health and Human Services from collecting data on guns and ammunition in households, and using it in any relation to health care.

It also bars insurers from taking into account the risks guns might pose to people's health in setting premiums or offering rebates to people with healthy lifestyles. For instance, if someone were to find people in houses with firearms were more likely to suffer a gun injury, it could not be used to set premiums, sort of like barring the use of pre-existing conditions. This is, of course, to protect gun owners' rights in health reform. The provisions are as follows ...

"(c) PROTECTION OF SECOND AMENDMENT GUN RIGHTS.—

(1) WELLNESS AND PREVENTION PROGRAMS.—A wellness and health promotion activity implemented under subsection (a)(1)(D) may not require the disclosure or collection of any information relating to— "(A) the presence or storage of a lawfully possessed firearm or ammunition in the residence or on the property of an individual; or "(B) the lawful use, possession, or storage of a firearm or ammunition by an individual.

(2) LIMITATION ON DATA COLLECTION.—None of the authorities provided to the Secretary under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act or an amendment made by that Act shall be construed to authorize or may be used for the collection of any information relating to— "(A) the lawful ownership or possession of a firearm or ammunition; "(B) the lawful use of a firearm or ammunition; or "(C) the lawful storage of a firearm or ammunition.

(3) LIMITATION ON DATABASES OR DATA BANKS.—None of the authorities provided to the Secretary under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act or an amendment made by that Act shall be construed to authorize or may be used to maintain records of individual ownership or possession of a firearm or ammunition.

(4) LIMITATION ON DETERMINATION OF PREMIUM RATES OR ELIGIBILITY FOR HEALTH INSURANCE.—A premium rate may not be increased, health insurance coverage may not be denied, and a discount, rebate, or reward offered for participation in a wellness program may not be reduced or withheld under any health benefit plan issued pursuant to or in accordance with the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act or an amendment made by that Act on the basis of, or on reliance upon— "(A) the lawful ownership or possession of a firearm or ammunition; or "(B) the lawful use or storage of a firearm or ammunition.

(5) LIMITATION ON DATA COLLECTION REQUIREMENTS FOR INDIVIDUALS.—No individual shall be required to disclose any information under any data collection activity authorized under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act or an amendment made by that Act relating to— "(A) the lawful ownership or possession of a firearm or ammunition; or "(B) the lawful use, possession, or storage of a firearm or ammunition."



For the third year in a row, the FBI *Preliminary Semiannual Uniform Crime Report* shows that violent crime, property crime, and arson have decreased. The latest report compares January-June 2009 figures with the same time period in 2008.

Without coincidence, statistics indicate firearm ownership and registration has continued to steadily

Individual crimes are also decreasing across the board:

- Murder (down 10.0 percent);
- Forcible rape (down 3.3 percent);
- Robbery (down 6.5 percent);
- Aggravated assault (down 3.2 percent);
- Burglary (down 2.5 percent);
- Larceny-theft (down 5.3 percent); and
- Motor vehicle theft (down 18.7 percent).

Other interesting highlights:

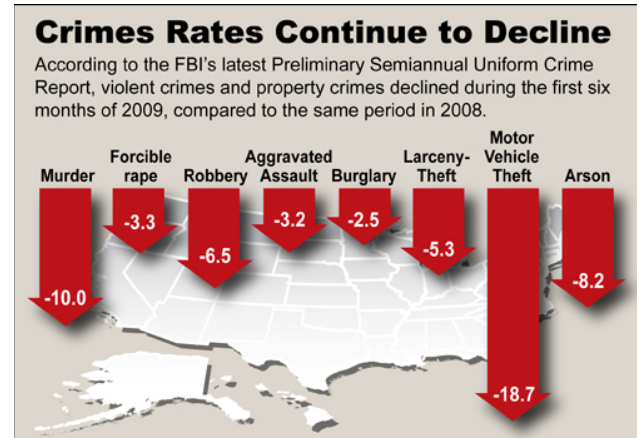
- Murder was lower in all four regions of the country, with the largest decreases in the Northeast (13.7 percent) and the West (13.3 percent).
- Motor vehicle thefts decreased significantly in all four regions of the country (Northeast, 19.3 percent; Midwest, 21.4 percent; South, 17.8 percent; and West, 18.2 percent).
- While violent crime and aggravated assault were down in cities of more than one million people (7.0 percent and 6.2 percent, respectively), in cities of populations between 10,000 and 24,999, violent crime rose 1.7 percent and aggravated assault rose 3.8 percent.
- While both metropolitan areas and non-metropolitan areas experienced decreases in violent crime and property crime in general, non-metropolitan counties saw increases in robbery (3.8 percent) and arson (1.2 percent).
- On a regional basis, the only increase in any crime was a slight increase in burglaries in the South (up 0.7 percent).

Developing this national view of crime is a collective effort of the FBI and the thousands of city, university/college, county, state, tribal, and federal law enforcement agencies that submit the data to us. Participating agencies throughout the country voluntarily provide reports on crimes known to police and on persons arrested.

The data has become a source of information used widely by police administrators, government policy makers, social science researchers, the media, and others concerned about the impact of crime in our communities. We do, however, caution against drawing conclusions from our data by making direct comparisons between law enforcement agencies—valid assessments

increase across the United States for the past three years. Especially with women ages 25-45.

Crimes reported to our Uniform Crime Program are down collectively: violent crime overall decreased 4.4 percent, property crime 6.1 percent, and arson 8.2 percent



are possible ONLY with careful study and analysis of the range of unique conditions affecting each local law enforcement jurisdiction.

The FBI has been collecting crime data from our law enforcement partners since the 1930s. Over the years, the scope of the program has expanded in response to suggestions from law enforcement advisory groups or to comply with federal mandates. Today, the culmination of this national data collection is three annual publications: *Crime in the United States*, *Hate Crime Statistics*, and *Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted*, as well as semiannual reports like this one. The full 2009 *Crime in the U.S.* report will be released later next year.



Rep. Tiahrt to Mayors: Stop Politicizing Fort Hood Deaths

WASHINGTON—U.S. Congressman Todd Tiahrt, R-Kan., released the following statement this December in response to heinous accusations from Mayor Michael Bloomberg's political organization Mayors Against Illegal Guns (MAIG). The Bloomberg organization paid for a full-page advertisement in the Washington Post assigning blame for the Fort Hood massacre, in part, to the firearm policy authored by Tiahrt and approved by Congress since 2002.

"The mayors who politicized the tragic deaths of those whose lives were taken along with the dozens who sustained injuries at Fort Hood should immediately issue a public apology to the victims and their families," said Tiahrt. "Their use of soldiers' deaths, their smear campaign against me, and their attempt to deceitfully change public policy disgraces their reputations as public servants. Using the Fort Hood massacre to advance a devious ad campaign dishonors the freedoms our men and women in uniform have paid the ultimate sacrifice to protect. Americans everywhere should be outraged and demand that each of these mayors be held accountable.

"The Tiahrt trace data amendment prevents the release of confidential law enforcement data to the public while making certain it is provided to local, state and federal

law enforcement officials for use in criminal investigations. That's why the Fraternal Order of Police, the world's largest organization of sworn law enforcement officers, supports the Tiahrt trace data amendment.

"Contrary to what Mayors Against Illegal Guns (MAIG) have asserted, the Tiahrt amendment does not affect background check outcomes, does not affect who is permitted to own a firearm, and does not restrict law enforcement officials from accessing and effectively using all available firearm data for criminal investigations. Allowing the federal government to maintain a firearm registry of law-abiding American citizens who have passed a background test will do nothing to prevent terrorist attacks. Retaining a federal registry for 45 days or even 45 years will not make us any safer but will expose which citizens own guns and how many they own – something every violent criminal would like to access.

"Unfortunately, many opponents of the Tiahrt language, including New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg, appear to be more interested in lawsuits against firearm manufacturers than about protecting law enforcement officers, the public, and privacy rights of law-abiding citizens who own firearms."

Senator Burr Ignoring Taxpayers on Blowing Rock Land Grab – *from Grass Roots North Carolina*

Recently local citizens were updated on the Blowing Rock Land Trade which is currently awaiting a vote in the U.S. Senate. Senator Richard Burr co-sponsored Senate Bill 1767 which would give the National Park Service control of 192 acres of land currently owned by the Town of Blowing Rock. Grass Roots North Carolina (GRNC) has asked Senator Burr to amend the bill to allow taxpayers the opportunity to continue to hunt on some of the last accessible public land near Blowing Rock. Senator Burr however, does not seem interested in hearing the views of concerned GRNC members who -- to date -- have not had a voice in the land trade.

One of Senator Burr's support staff recently made the statement that the land trade is a local decision that has been a topic of local discussion in Blowing Rock for a decade. Local hunters and shooters in Blowing Rock know this to be untrue. The land trade is not a local decision since the Town of Blowing Rock lobbied on Capitol Hill on April 23, 2009, to have the land trade heard by Congress. Conspicuously absent from House hearings were GRNC members who were intentionally

kept out of the lobbying effort until 5:00 PM the day before Blowing Rock Manager Scott Hildebran traveled to D.C. to do the Town's bidding - far too late for concerned citizens to have a say in proceedings. Not even town councilmember Thomas Klutz, who was sympathetic to local hunters, was privy to Hildebran's covert trip to the Capitol.

As for the land trade being a topic of discussion for a decade, this too is inaccurate. Hunters and shooters were not even aware that Blowing Rock had purchased the 192 acre parcel from the Nature Conservancy until the local police department tried to prevent hunters from accessing game lands adjoining the 192 acre parcel in 2005. Town officials, and now Senator Burr, claim the land trade was discussed in public which is technically true. It was discussed at the annual councilmember retreat in Ashville, NC last January. Discussing the land trade on a weekday over 100 miles from Blowing Rock hardly qualifies as being transparent to the taxpayer. Town officials also claim they discussed the land trade during a March 2009 town hall meeting. GRNC members



were on hand at this meeting only to be told the meeting was going into closed session to discuss unrelated issues. After GRNC members exited the building, Mayor J. B. Lawrence deftly reopened the town hall meeting to discuss the land trade. Interestingly, no video or written minutes exist of this supposed re-opened meeting.

Why does Senator Burr take at face value everything the Town of Blowing Rock says despite the cries of concerned citizens who have shown that the Town has been non-transparent and evasive in all matters relating to the land trade? Concerned GRNC members, along with local sportspersons, asked Senator Burr's office to

allow them to address Congress in the same manner that Town Manager Scott Hildebran did this past May - before S 1767 was presented to the Senate Subcommittee on National Parks. Senator Burr's Office indicated that they would only accept written comments for the Congressional Record after the bill was heard by the subcommittee. Please contact Senator Burr and persuade him to listen to the views of the electorate, not a town government focused on a questionable land trade likely for personal gain. Senator Burr still has time to introduce a floor amendment to remove the land grab and protect the rights of hunters in this area.
